

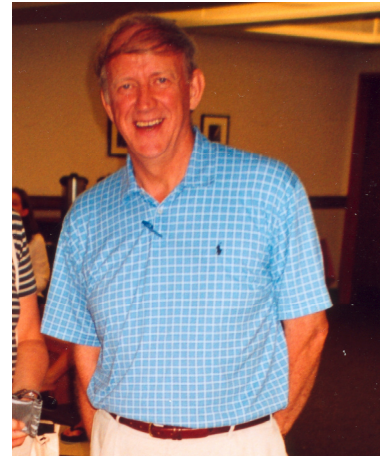

### ***Special contributions to the theory of RE; some notes about your personal intentions, criticism of other positions or approaches, in short what you want to change and develop.***

My life-work has been most identified with my efforts to articulate an approach to religious education that I term *Shared Christian (or Jewish, etc.) Praxis*. It can be summarized as a pedagogy that encourages people to "bring their lives to Faith (whatever religion is under study) and Faith to their lives." I've written a number of books about this approach (e.g. *Christian Religious Education*, 1980), *Sharing Faith* 1991), and *Will There Be Faith* (2011). However, it can be summarized as simply as "life to Faith to life."

I have also implemented this approach in at least two major children's curricula (*God With us* and *Coming to Faith* – both from W. H. Sadlier) and am now writing a curriculum for adolescents entitled *The Credo Series* from Veritas Pub. Co.

Originally (35 years ago at dissertation time) my work was much influenced by Paulo Freire in pedagogy, Gustavo Gutierrez in theology, Jurgen Habermas and Hans Gadamer in philosophy. These influences have continued. As a Christian religious educator, I'm deeply convinced that educating in Christian faith should be emancipatory for the person, the community, and the society. It should enable people to grow in holiness/wholeness of life and to contribute to the common good of society – toward the reign of God.
